ON NEXT WEDNESDAY 6TH JANUARY WE CELEBRATE THE SOLMENITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD which is a Holy Day of Obligation. Mass Time (via webcam): 10.00am. The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as the Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Saviour of the world. The great feast celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (magi) from the East, together with his baptism in the Jordan and the wedding feast of Cana in Galilee. In the magi, representatives of the neighbouring pagan religions, the Gospel seen the first-fruits of the nations, who welcome the good news of salvation through the incarnation (CCC.528)
