Sunday's Gospel JN 14:15:21 If you love Me you will keep my commandments



Anyone who receives my commandments and keeps them will be one who loves me; John 4:21

Our Gospel today in one which offers us both a great consolation and a great challenge at the same time. The setting for our Gospel takes place during the Last Supper, where Jesus speaks openly to His Apostles about His approaching death and going to the Father. Sensing their pain and anguish Jesus comforts them by assuring them that He will rise again and be with them in a new way. And though they will lack His physical presence He will send them another Advocate to be with you forever, to comfort and teach them, so they will not be left orphans. This same promise also applies to us. Therefore there is a great mystery of hope contained in todays Gospel and we should take courage from it. As no matter what trials or tribulations arise in the future, we will never have to face the alone, as Christ Himself and His Holy Spirit will always be with us and ready to help us when needed. But more importantly they are both

trying to lead us closer to God, if only we would truly open up to the help they are offering. But todays Gospel also contains a great challenge for us, in that Jesus clearly tells us If you love me you will keep my commandments. Jesus is very definite here as He does not say "try to keep but a very clear and definite you will keep. And what were His commandments that we must keep—forgive our enemies, bless those who persecute us, give to the poor, turn the other cheek, love as I have loved you, and so on. If you love me you will keep my commandments. This is not so much about keeping a set of rules but more about living our faith everyday. People will recognise true Christians, by the way we live our lives and there lies the challenge for us. Do we live our lives in love for others as Christ did? Do we care for people who are sick, old, poor? Do we visit prisoners, feed people who are hungry, clothe those who have nothing? Do we really care if another person in pain, afraid or sad? Or is it a case better them than me? Can we truly put their needs first without thinking about what we deserve? Or is our religion, our faith only words, only for inside a Church building?

If you love me you will keep my commandments. At the end of the day we really wouldn't be much of a Christian if we don't live and love as Jesus taught us.

It's a chilly day by the seaside, far too windy for my comfort. But the gulls don't seem to mind the wind. In fact they seem to enjoy it. I watch them flying about: they go with it, they go against it, they soar into the sky, they plunge back to earth. All the time they are using the wind, they are availing of its power.
