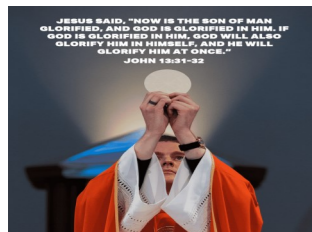
PRAYER BY TELEPHONE

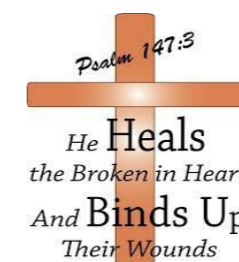
