St. Ignatius of Loyola

1491-1556, from the north of Spain, founded the Society of Jesus. By the time of his death, the Society had spread widely and had over one thousand members. His great theme was the service of God and God’s greater glory. The experience of his conversion led to his writing of the Spiritual Exercises. Ignatius' passed away on July 31, 1556, at the age of 64. He was beatified by Pope Paul V on July 27th, 1609 and canonized on March 12th, 1622. His feast day is July 31st. He is the patron saint of the Society of Jesus, soldiers, educators and education.

St. John Baptist Mary Vianney

(1786-1859) was born in Dardilly and died in Ars, France. Although his talents were limited and his education meager, he was ordained a priest in 1815. After three years at Ecully, he was appointed parish priest of Ars. The marvellous gift of the unlearned priest for seeing into the depths of the soul brought the world to Ars. Here he spent almost forty-two years of his life, devoting himself to prayer, mortification, and pastoral works and averaged twelve to sixteen hours a day in the confessional. His success in directing souls made him known throughout the Christian world. Men of all ranks and conditions of life sought his guidance and advice.
The Holy Curé of Ars was canonized by Pope Pius XI in 1925. He is the patron of priests. Over 450,000 pilgrims travel to Ars every year in remembrance of his holy life.
